1. AIMAG Riyadh 2026

The Asian Indoor and Martial Arts Games (AIMAG) is a major continental multi-sport event organized by the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA). It brings together indoor and martial arts disciplines, providing a unique platform for athletes across Asia to compete at the highest level while promoting unity, diversity, and sporting excellence throughout the region.

The 6th edition of the Games will be hosted in Riyadh, Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, from 11–21 December 2026, featuring 18 sports across combat, team, and individual disciplines. Organized by the Riyadh AIMAG 2026 Local Organizing Committee (LOC)

The Games will be centered around Boulevard Riyadh City, the main competition hub, while the Athlete Village will be located at Princess Nourah bint Abdulrahman University, providing accommodation and essential services for participating athletes.

Under the slogan "Asia in the Heart of Riyadh," AIMAG Riyadh 2026 reflects the Kingdom's commitment to bringing Asia together through sport, culture, and hospitality. The Opening Ceremony will take place on 13 December 2026, marking another milestone in Saudi Arabia's growing role in hosting world-class sporting events.

1.1 Riyadh Overview

Riyadh, the capital of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, serves as the country's political, economic, and cultural center. As one of the region's leading metropolitan cities, Riyadh combines modern infrastructure with a rich cultural and historical heritage.

The city offers world-class sporting facilities, advanced transportation networks, and a wide range of hospitality, entertainment, and cultural attractions. Riyadh is also home to Diriyah, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that reflects the Kingdom's history and cultural identity.

2.1. Athletes' Village Overview

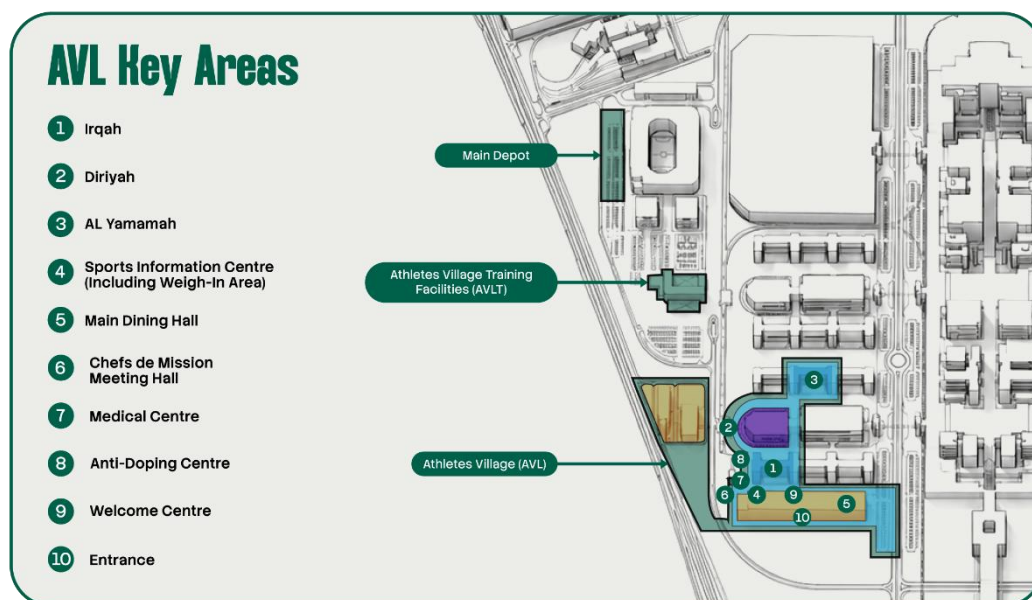
The Athletes' Village is the premier residential hub for athletes and team officials participating in major international sporting events hosted by the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. As the Kingdom's first dedicated sports village, it represents a significant milestone in Saudi Arabia's sporting journey and its commitment to delivering world-class sporting events and exceptional athlete experiences.

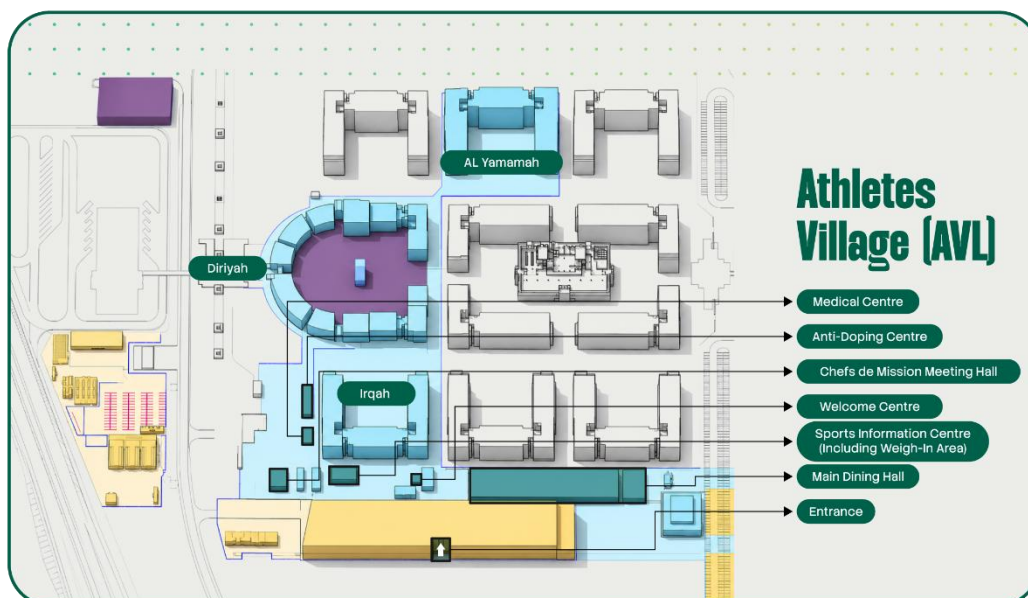
Following the successful hosting of the Islamic Solidarity Games Riyadh 2025, the Athletes' Village received widespread recognition for its outstanding organization, operational excellence, hospitality, and athlete-centered services. The Village has been designed to provide a safe, comfortable, and welcoming environment that enables athletes to focus on their performance while enjoying a unique cultural and social experience.

The Village offers more than 1,300 fully furnished and equipped rooms across multiple residential buildings and has the capacity to accommodate approximately 3,400 athletes and team officials during peak operations. The accommodation is organized into dedicated Resident Centers, each supported by professional operational teams providing a full range of services throughout the Games period.

Designed as a vibrant community rather than simply an accommodation facility, the Athletes' Village brings together athletes and team officials from across Asia in an environment that promotes friendship, cultural exchange, and the values of sport. The Village serves as a home away from home where participants can prepare, compete, recover, and connect with fellow athletes from diverse nations and sporting disciplines

2.2. Athletes' Village Map





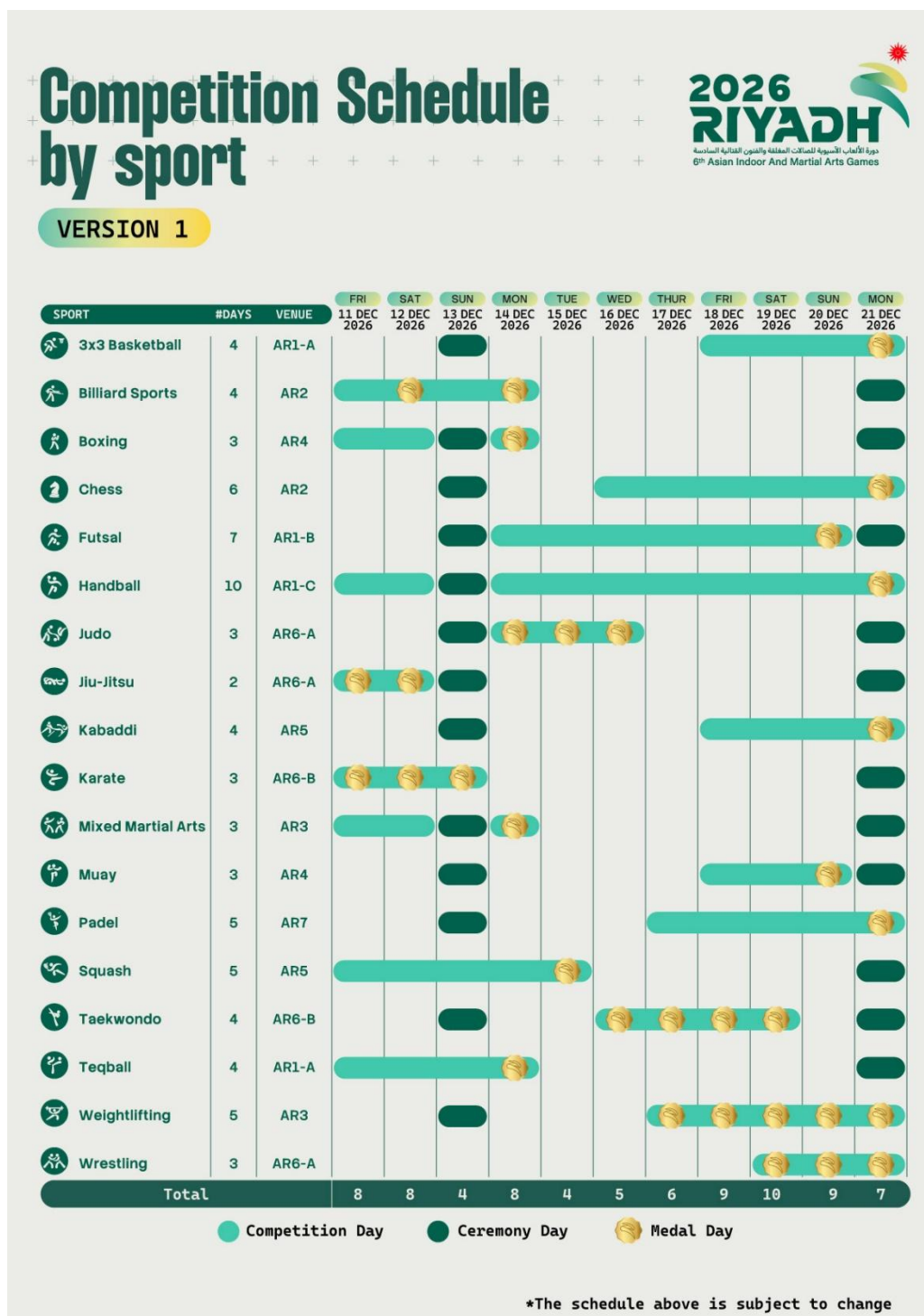
3. Accreditation

The AIMAG Identity and Accreditation Card will serve as the official identification for all accredited Games participants, including Technical Officials, and will grant access to Games venues according to their assigned roles. Accreditation cards will be issued and validated upon arrival in Riyadh at the designated accreditation facilities.

All participants must present the same valid passport used during the accreditation application process. The accreditation card must be carried at all times and presented when accessing Games venues, Training Venues and Sport Information Center.

6.2.OCA Generic

All athletes must meet the OCA and respective IF/AF eligibility requirements. The OCA eligibility requirements are outlined in Article 52, Article 53, and the corresponding By-laws of the OCA Constitution and Rules (March 2019 edition). In addition, all athletes and team officials are required to hold a valid certificate from the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Anti-Doping Education and Learning (ADEL) platform.

6.3.Age

There are no age restrictions for athletes to be eligible to participate in AIMAG 2026.

6.4.IF ID

To be eligible to compete in AIMAG 2026, athletes must hold a valid FIDE ID at the moment of Entry by Name registration.

6.5.Team officials

Team officials (coaches, non-playing captains) should have a valid FIDE ID.

Individual Events: Each NOC may enter a maximum of two (2) athletes in each event. An athlete may be entered in two events.

Total: Each NOC may enter a maximum of four (4) athletes, including two (2) men and two (2) women.

6.7. Late Athlete Replacement

Following the Entry by Name deadline (31 October 2026), the OCA (in consultation with the relevant TD/IF or AF) may approve a permanent replacement of an athlete by another eligible athlete for any medical or special circumstances.

Before submitting an LAR request the NOC must ensure that the replacement athlete meets the following conditions: complies with the OCA Constitution Article 52, has been registered on the AIMAG 2026 Accreditation Long List, has no pending doping issues and holds a valid WADA Anti-Doping Education Certificate (ADEL).

The LAR requests must be submitted by the NOCs via email to OCA, the AIMAG 2026 Sport Entries team and the NOC relations team and include the following attachments: signed LAR form, medical documents, X-ray (if needed), signed AIMAG 2026 Conditions of participation and Parental / Legal Guardian Consent Forms.

For Chess, Late Athlete Replacements (LAR) shall only be permitted up to the Technical / Team Managers' Meeting. Upon conclusion of this meeting, all entries shall be deemed final and binding. No further LAR shall be permitted thereafter by the AFs/IFs, Organizing Committee, or the OCA.

7. Technical Information

7.1. Competition Venue

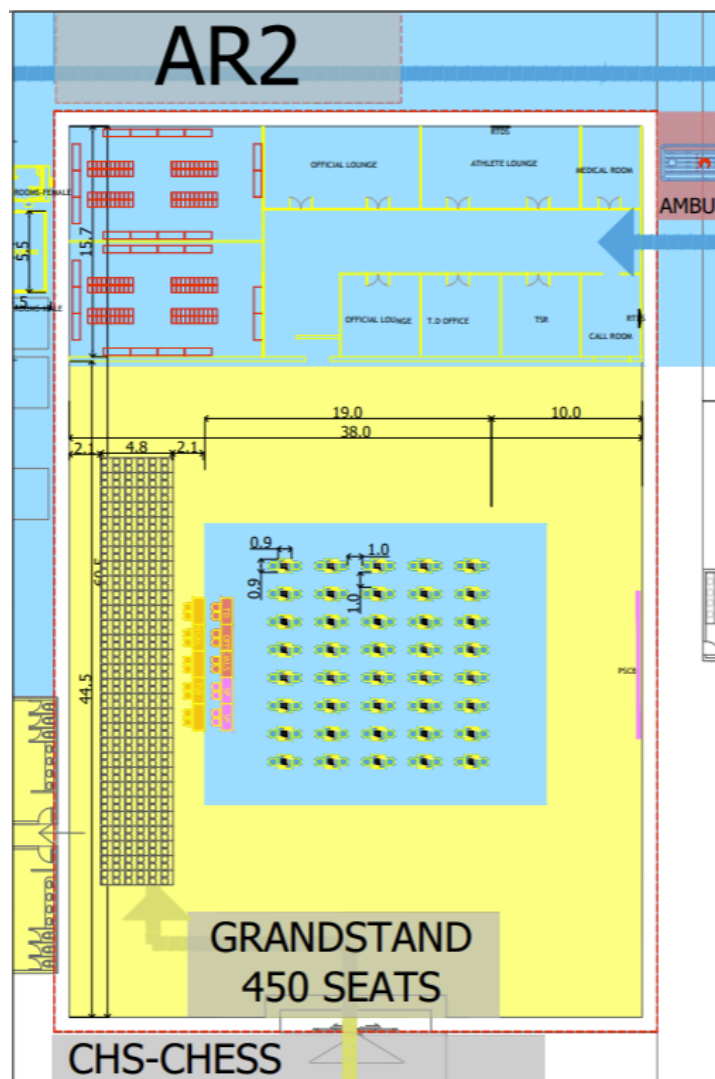
The AIMAG Riyadh 2026 competition venues will be in Boulevard City, one of the city's most prominent entertainment and sports destinations. The venues will utilize a combination of existing facilities and temporary setups to ensure efficient operations and a high-quality competition environment for athletes, officials, and spectators.

This approach supports sustainability while minimizing additional construction requirements. Located in the heart of Riyadh, Boulevard City will provide a vibrant atmosphere for the Games, offering world-class facilities, entertainment areas, and easy accessibility for participants and fans. Hosting competitions in such an iconic destination will enhance the overall experience of AIMAG Riyadh 2026 and contribute to creating a memorable sporting celebration in the city.

7.2. Field of Play and Back of House

- The Field of Play (FOP) includes the Chess competition area, comprising the playing zone, surrounding operational spaces, and integrated audience seating, all designed to ensure optimal visibility, comfort, and performance.
- The FOP will accommodate forty (40) digital chess boards arranged to ensure efficient use of space and smooth movement for players and officials.
- The Back of House (BOH) consists of support spaces such as changing rooms, storage, medical room, Technical Delegate (TD) office, offices, call Room, Warm up area, and athlete lounges, enabling smooth venue operations.

7.3. Competition Rules

- The Chess competition of AIMAG2026 will be held as per the latest technical and competition guidelines of the International Chess Federation (FIDE).
- Detailed information is available on the website of the FIDE:

- In case of any disagreement in the interpretation of the FIDE rules and regulations, the English version shall prevail. Any unforeseen circumstances not covered by the regulations and rules shall be resolved as follows:
- Technical issues: Resolved in accordance with the FIDE rules and regulations by TD.
- General issues: Resolved in accordance with the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) Constitution and Rules.

7.4. Competition Format

Chess competitions at AIMAG 2026 will be conducted in accordance with the rules of the International Chess Federation (FIDE) and the Asian Chess Federation (ACF).

- The competition format will consist of a preliminary stage followed by knockout rounds.
- Players will be divided into two groups, where each group will compete in a Swiss system or round-robin format over seven (7) rounds, depending on the number of participants.
- The top two (2) players/teams from each group will advance to the knockout stage, consisting of semifinals and finals.

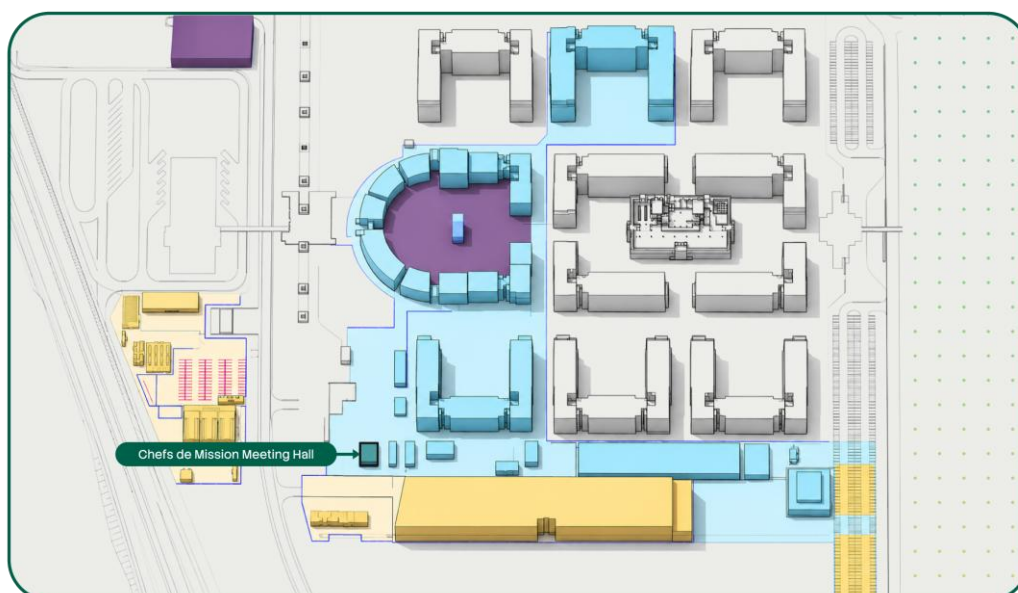

8. Anti-Doping

The AIMAG fully supports the principles of clean sport and fair play. Anti-doping activities during the Games will be conducted in accordance with the World Anti-Doping Code, the International Standards of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), and the applicable anti-doping rules of the respective International Federations.

8.1. Testing Authority

The designated anti-doping authority appointed for the Games will oversee and manage all anti-doping operations during the event, in coordination with the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) and in accordance with applicable Games governance and guidance arrangements.

8.2. In-Competition and Out-of-Competition Testing:

Athletes may be selected for:

- In-Competition Testing.
- Out-of-Competition Testing.

In accordance with the Code, International Standards, and the applicable Rules, InCompetition refers to the period commencing at 11:59 p.m. on the day before a competition through the end of the sample collection process related to that competition.

Out-of-Competition refers to any period that is not classified as In-Competition.

Testing may take place at competition venues, training venues, hotels, or any other designated location during the Games period.

8.3. Athlete Rights and Responsibilities

Athletes' rights include:

- Having a representative and, if available, an interpreter.
- Requesting additional information.
- Requesting a delay in reporting to the Doping Control Station for valid reasons, as determined by the Doping Control Officer (DCO).

Athletes' responsibilities include:

- Remaining in direct view of the DCO or Chaperone at all times after notification
- Checking all medications and supplements
- Providing valid identification
- Reporting immediately to the Doping Control Station when notified
- Complying with sample collection procedures, as failure to do so may constitute an anti-doping rule violation

Athletes should familiarize themselves with the WADA Prohibited List and all relevant anti-doping procedures.

8.4. Doping Control Notification

Selected athletes will be notified by an authorized Doping Control Officer (DCO) or Chaperone. From the moment of notification, the athlete remains under observation until completion of the doping control process.

8.5. Doping Control Station

Doping Control Stations (DCS) will be established at designated competition venues and operated according to international anti-doping standards. Only authorized personnel and accredited representatives may access the Doping Control Station. Each station will include a waiting area and a private sample collection room.

Sealed drinks will be provided at the DCS, and athletes are encouraged to hydrate. Athletes must ensure that the beverage is securely sealed before consuming it. However, athletes should avoid overhydration to reduce the possibility of producing a diluted sample. Providing a diluted sample may significantly prolong the doping control process.

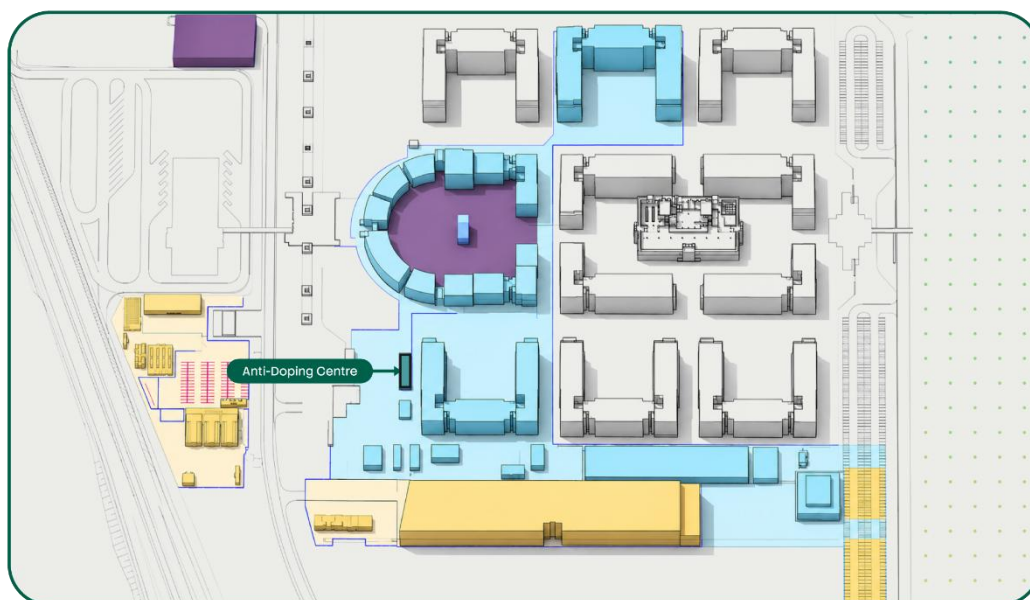
8.6. Therapeutic Use Exemptions (TUE)

Athletes requiring the use of prohibited substances or methods for legitimate medical reasons, as specified in the 2026 Prohibited List, must possess a valid Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) in accordance with WADA and International Federation regulations. Supporting medical documentation related to the condition, including medical reports and diagnostic records where applicable, should be available.

8.7. Failure to Comply

Failure to comply with anti-doping procedures, including refusal to submit to testing or failure to report to Doping Control, may constitute an anti-doping rule violation.

9. Athlete Clothing/Uniforms

- *Athletes may wear either the official uniform of their respective National Olympic Committee (NOC) or the traditional national attire officially representing their country.*

10. Athlete Services

10.1. Sport Equipment

The competition will be delivered using official DGT chess equipment, including:

- DGT official chess boards
- DGT official chess pieces
- DGT 3000 digital chess clocks

The complete list of Sport equipment to be used for the Chess event is attached as Appendix 1.

10.2. Athlete Training Schedule

General Information – Training Center

Location: Training v Location

Accessibility: The Training Center is located approximately 5 minutes walking distance from the Athletes' Village.

Operating Hours: 07:00 – 23:00 daily

Introduction

The Training Center within the Athletes' Village is designed to provide a structured, accessible, high-quality environment for athletes to prepare and perform at their best during AIMAG Riyadh 2026. It operates as a centralized hub for training and recovery across all participating delegations, ensuring fairness, efficiency, and athlete well-being.

Training Policies

- Training sessions for Billiard will be available two (2) days prior to the start of the competition and throughout the competition period, based on the approved competition schedule.
- Training venue allocations will be communicated to all participating NOCs prior to the start of training operations. Training sessions will be conducted strictly according to the approved competition schedule.
- Each participating NOC will be allocated one (1) training area per session, subject to the official training schedule and venue availability.
- If an NOC does not intend to use its allocated training session, it must inform the Training Center Team.
- Training will take place at Billiard Hall.
- Modification and Cancellation Policy: To be added later (TBC).
- Sessions will generally last 45 – 60 minutes, depending on sport requirements.
- A dedicated booking system will be available for managing and reserving training sessions.

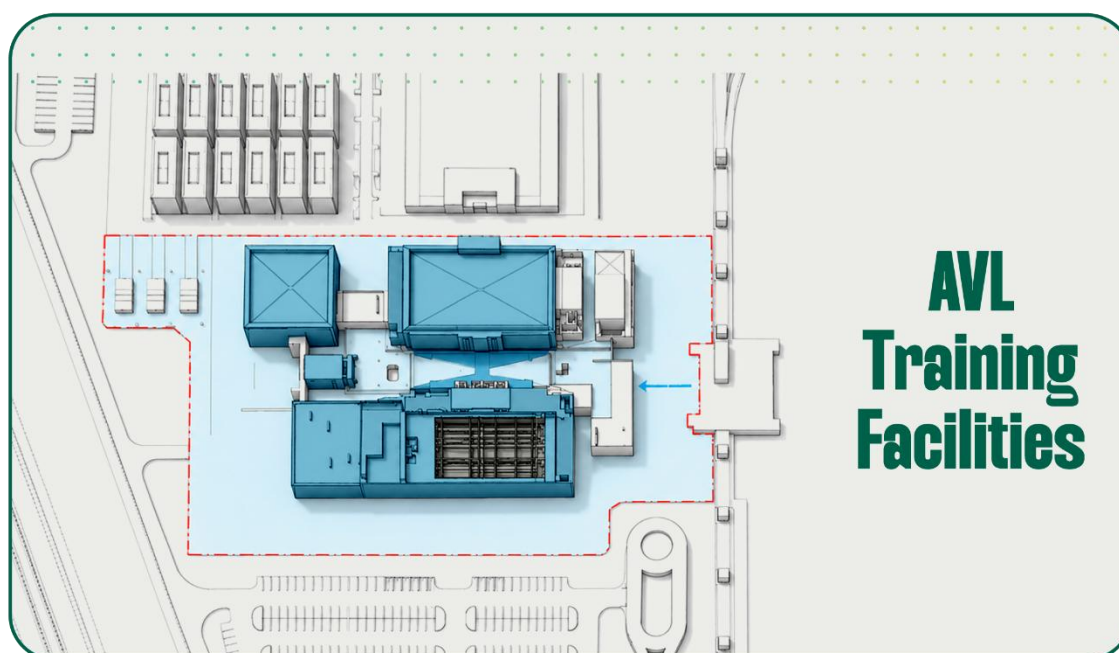
Booking Process

- All training requests must be submitted formally through the official booking system; no informal or direct requests will be accepted.
- Each National Olympic Committee (NOC) or Federation will appoint one Point of Contact (POC) responsible for submitting and managing bookings.
- Submitted requests will be reviewed, prioritized, and confirmed according to venue availability, sport requirements, and competition schedules

11. Medical Services

Medical services will be provided throughout the duration of the event to ensure the health, safety, and well-being of all athletes, team officials, referees, volunteers, workforce, and spectators. The Local Organizing Committee (LOC), in cooperation with the relevant health authorities and medical partners, will implement a comprehensive medical services plan covering all competition and training venues.

11.1. Competition Venue Medical Services

Each competition venue will be equipped with

- Field-of-Play (FOP) medical teams
- Ambulance services
- Emergency response teams
- Athlete medical treatment areas
- Spectator medical services
- Dedicated medical personnel for athletes and officials

Medical teams will be present during all official training sessions and competition sessions. Medical services will be aligned with the AIMAG 2026 CDM Medical Chapter and operated according to international sports medicine standards.

11.2. Athlete Medical Care

The Athletes Village Medical Clinic will provide primary care, physiotherapy, and recovery services for non-emergency cases. A dedicated workspace for NOC team doctors will be made available within the Athletes Village, subject to final operational planning. Athletes requiring medical attention during training or competition should immediately contact the venue medical staff or their team doctor. Medical services available at venues include:

- Emergency medical treatment
- First aid services
- Basic injury assessment
- Immediate stabilization and transfer if required

Any additional treatment, specialist consultation, imaging, surgery, rehabilitation, or hospitalization outside venue medical operations may be subject to local healthcare regulations and procedures.

11.3. Ambulance and Emergency Procedures

Dedicated ambulances with emergency medical personnel will be stationed at all competition venues during operational hours. In case of serious injury or medical emergency, athletes or officials may be transferred to designated hospitals identified by the LOC.

11.4. Team Medical Personnel

NOCs may register their own medical personnel in accordance with the accreditation and registration procedures established by AIMAG 2026. Detailed requirements will be communicated separately to NOC medical teams.

11.5. Medical Insurance

On-venue emergency medical treatment will be provided free of charge by the LOC. Hospitalization, specialist care, and non-emergency treatment outside competition venues remain subject to applicable healthcare regulations and the athlete's or NOC's insurance arrangements.

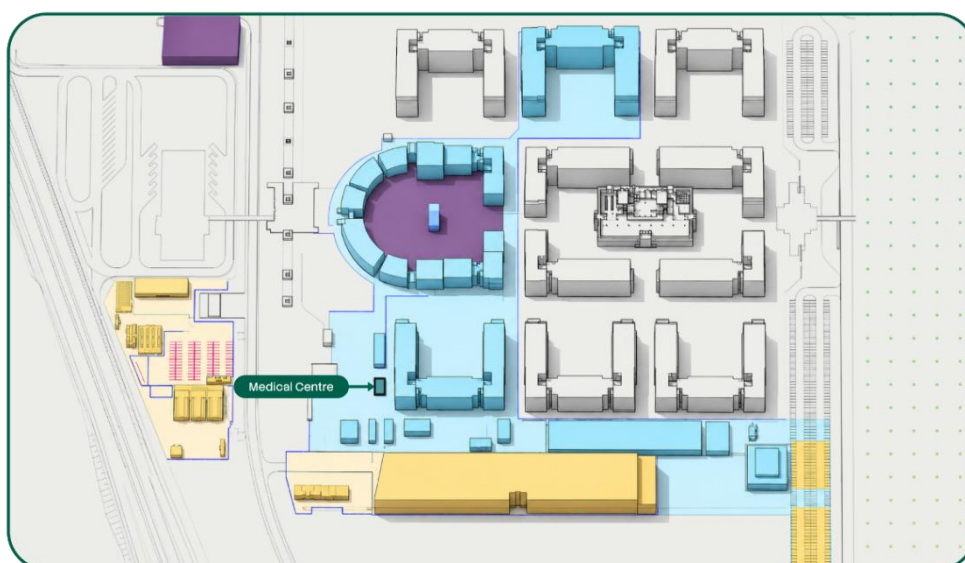
11.6. Environmental Conditions

All participants are advised to pay particular attention to hydration, recovery, and environmental conditions during the event period. The LOC may issue additional medical advisories or operational procedures depending on weather conditions, public health considerations, or venue-specific requirements.

11.7. Import of Medicines and Medical Equipment

Import of medicines, controlled substances, and medical equipment for participating delegations is regulated by the Saudi Food and Drug Authority (SFDA). NOC medical teams must follow the procedures set out in the AIMAG 2026 Medical Imports Guide.

12. Sport Information Center

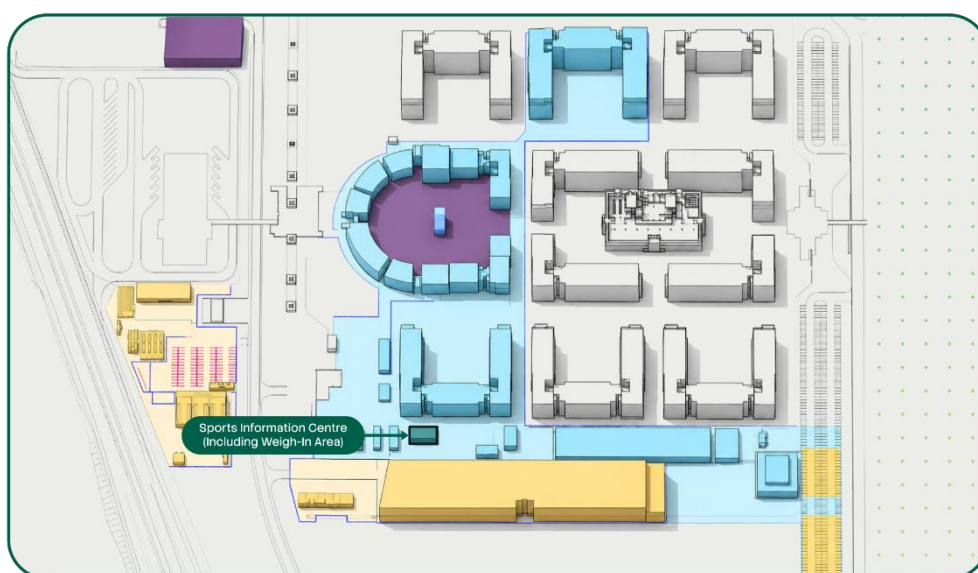
The Sport Information Center serves as the primary information hub for athletes and team officials throughout RAIMAG 2026. It is responsible for organizing daily combat sport weigh-ins and coordinating BIB application on sport uniforms for eligible participants through dedicated sewing facilities.

The center's core function is to deliver timely, accurate, and live updates on schedules, transportation, and venue-related information across all venues, ensuring consistent communication by the Sport Information Center. Through continuous information dissemination and coordination, it supports the efficient flow of information for RAIMAG 2026 and contributes to smooth athlete movement and the overall delivery of competition activities.

13. Sport Presentation & Medal Ceremonies

The AIMAG aims to deliver a professional and engaging sport presentation experience that enhances the atmosphere for athletes, spectators, broadcasters, and stakeholders.

Sport presentation activities may include:

- Athlete introductions;
- Music and entertainment;
- Video content;
- Announcements;
- Lighting and audiovisual effects;
- Medal ceremonies.

13.1. Sport Presentation

The sport presentation program will be managed by the Local Organizing Committee in coordination with the International Federations. All participants are expected to follow venue operational procedures and instructions from sport presentation staff.

13.2. Athlete Introductions

Athletes may be introduced prior to competition sessions, finals, or medal ceremonies.

Athletes and coaches are requested to follow all timing instructions and operational procedures to ensure smooth delivery.

13.3. Medal Ceremonies

Medal ceremonies will be conducted according to the competition schedule and the protocol procedures established by the LOC and the respective International Federation. Athletes winning medals are required to attend the official medal ceremony.

Athletes must wear:

- Their official team tracksuit;
- Appropriate sports shoes;
- Their accreditation.

Flags, banners, political statements, demonstrations, or unauthorized items are not permitted during medal ceremonies unless explicitly approved by the organizers.

13.4. Medal Ceremony Operations

Athletes selected for medal ceremonies must report to the designated medal ceremony call room or staging area at the time specified by the organizers. Failure to attend medal ceremonies without valid justification may result in disciplinary measures or sanctions in accordance with the applicable rules and regulations.

13.5. National Anthems and Flags

National anthems and flags used during medal ceremonies will be provided and managed by the organizers based on official information received from the participating delegations.

13.6. Photography and Media

Official photographers and broadcast crews may be present during medal ceremonies and sport presentation activities. Athletes may be requested to cooperate with official media and broadcast procedures.

13.7.Victory Ceremonies Protocol

Athletes are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful and professional manner throughout all medal ceremonies and official protocol activities. The organizers reserve the right to modify sport presentation and medal ceremony procedures in accordance with operational, broadcast, security, or scheduling requirements.
